Learn from the pros

During the conference, students will have a special opportunity to attend two 45-minute instructional sessions taught by leading industry professionals.

While the list of courses is dependent upon the availability the specific skills and abilities of industry mentors, such areas of concentration might include: voiceover techniques, newsgathering techniques, portfolio preparation, audio production techniques, or music management in radio.

Who May Enter?

The contest is open to high school students in the State of Washington affiliated with radio broadcasting programs. In addition, schools that offer broadcast-related courses within a state-approved Career and Technical Education program will also be eligible. Each school will be allowed up to three entries in each category. A student is allowed to enter in as many as three different categories.

Call for entries

Contest entries submitted by schools and students must be postmarked on or before Friday, April 17. Winners will be announced during the Conference. Entries must be submitted on either CD or mini disc. They must be clearly marked with the name of the student, school, and competitive category.

Seeking sponsorship
